

## PhD in English Literatures and Cultures - Call for Applications 2024-2025

The PhD program of the English Department at the University of Haifa welcomes applicants interested in pursuing doctoral dissertations in various periods, fields, and approaches in the study of English literatures and cultures, including British, American, and Postcolonial Literatures.

Once accepted to the program, qualified candidates will be considered for one of several University of Haifa Fellowships for outstanding students, with a total of 240,000 NIS over 4 years for qualifying students.
